Transcript

The numbers in Spanish from 21 to 30 can be divided in 2 groups:

In Group 1 the numbers in Spanish between 21 and 29 are formed by the word “venti” and the equivalent number from 1 to 9 right next to it.

As a note, “venti” sounds like “veinte y” which means “twenty and”.

If you say 24 in Spanish, “veinticuatro” it sounds as if you said “veinte y cuatro” which translates as “twenty and four”.

This will make things easier as you learn these numbers.

Let’s look at the numbers from 21 to 29:
