Lesson 06:
Numbers in Spanish from 11 to 20
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Hola, in this short lesson we will take a look at the numbers in Spanish from 11 to 20. Let's get started.

Numbers in Spanish from 11 to 20 can be divided in three different groups that share common characteristics:

In Group 1 the first five numbers from 11 to 15, all end with " $c, e$ " and begin with letters that resemble their equivalent numbers from 1 to 5 . Let's see:

11 - once
12 - doce
13 - trece
14 - catorce
15 - quince

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In Group 2 the numbers from 16 to 19 begin with "dieci" and end with the equivalent numbers from 6 to 9 .

As a note, "dieci" sounds like "diez y" which means "10 and".

If you look at 17 which is "diecisiete", it sounds like "diez y siete" or "10 and 7" in English.

Now, let's look at the numbers:

16 - dieciséis
17 - diecisiete
18 - dieciocho
19 - diecinueve

Group 3 consists of the number 20, which in Spanish is "veinte".

20 - veinte

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Let's take a moment to review the numbers in Spanish from 11 to 20 one more time.

& 13 \text { - trece } \\
& 14 \text { - catorce } \\
& 15 \text { - quince } \\
& 16 \text { - dieciséis } \\
& 17 \text { - diecisiete } \\
& 18 \text { - dieciocho } \\
& 19 \text { - diecinueve } \\
& 20 \text { - veinte }
\end{aligned}
$$
